


Do's and Don'ts


Under rule 4.3 the use of distance-measuring devices is permitted however there are certain do's and don'ts that golfers need to be aware of:



Do's

You may use a device to:

- Measure straight line distance between two points;
- Access a club yardage chart based off historical information;
- Enter your hole scores;
- Enter shot information – for later analysis (e.g. club used and location);
- Access a local weather forecast.



Don'ts

You may not use a device to:

- Measure elevation changes;
- Calculate effective distance based on elevation changes or other conditions affecting shot distance (often called the plays like feature).
- Measure other conditions that might affect play (e.g., wind speed or direction);
- Interpret distance or directional information (such as using a device to get a recommended line of play or club selection).
